"What's an Emu?" CD

The "What's an Emu?" (School Lesson Plan), a CD resource originally created for teachers, is now available from Emu Today & Tomorrow (ET&T). This informative overview of emus and the products they provide, starts with a review of the ratite family that includes pictures of ostrich, emu, cassowary, rhea and kiwi. This slide show guides the viewer through the many unique qualities of the emu. After the comparison of the members of the ratite family, the slides move on to the emu skeleton, hatching emu chicks and the many products produced from this amazing creature. This totally usable bird provides nutritious lean meat, moisturizing emu oil, quilled emu leather, durable non-static producing double-vane feathers and edible eggs with dark green eggshells that are sought after by crafters for painting, decorating and carving.

The CD contains a WORD script to read along with the picture slides. The entire 13 slide presentation is in both PowerPoint and .pdf format. The presentation can be completed in less than 15 minutes.

The information on this CD can be used by emu growers for presentations, both for groups and during farm tours, or printed out to use at exhibit booths. These pages can be enlarged and laminated to use as a flip board presentation.

There is a second set of the 13 slides on the CD with self-explanatory information added to each slide. These pictures can be printed out on regular paper and arranged in a poster formation (great for booths or fairs) or you can have them enlarged to poster size to use with a flip board. This set could even be used to make a brochure (see attachment) or a booklet that explains "What's an Emu?'. The information provided is basic and it is interesting to both children and adults. There is a brochure that can be printed on the AEA website.
